### HOW TO GET YOUR INSURANCE CARD:

1. Check your email from [enrollment@visit-aci.com](mailto:enrollment@visit-aci.com)
2. The email subject will say "Thank you for purchasing Chubb Individual Travel Assistance Program: No. CETN....." The number at the end of the subject line is your Member ID/Policy Number
3. Scroll down in the email and click on the hyperlink [here](#)
4. This will open the [CHUBB website](#)
5. Scroll down and click on the orange box "Access Your Documents"
6. Scroll down and fill out your Date of Birth, your Member ID Number (that was sent in the subject line of the email mentioned above) and Coverage Start Date (The day the program began).
7. This will open a page with all your CHUBB Insurance info.

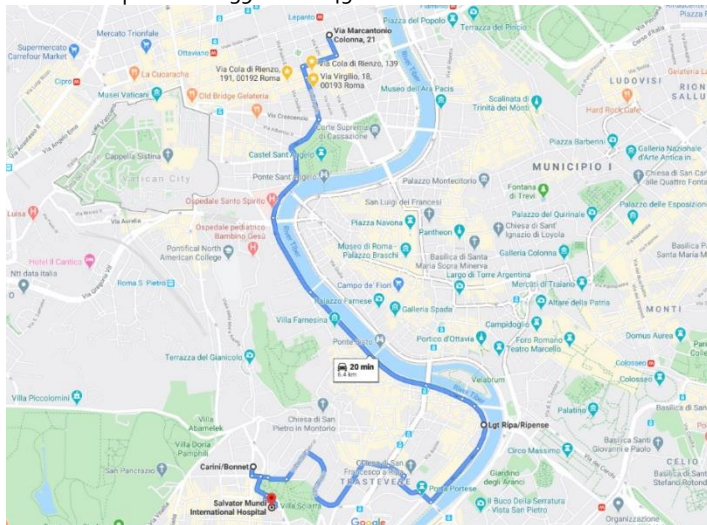
### How to obtain a guarantee of payment (GOP)

Please call the 24-7 travel assistance telephone number on your insurance ID card and the 24-7 travel assistance team will arrange direct billing with the provider so that you don't have to pay out of pocket. The telephone number is **001-630-694-9802** (from outside of the United

States). Please obtain a GOP before going to the hospital or having Dr. Guerriero come and visit you on campus. If you do not present your card during your appointment and/or do not obtain a GOP, you will be charged for the visit and you will have to file a reimbursement claim with Chubb. It is recommended you carry your Chubb insurance card with you at all times. **Make sure you retain all receipts from medical visits and prescriptions for reimbursement claim purposes.**

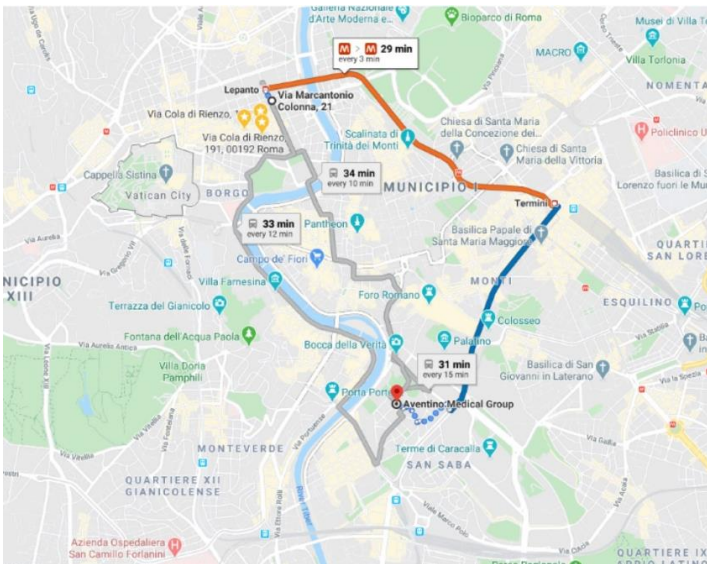

**Location:** Viale delle Mura Gianicolensi 67.  
**Directions from Campus:** Take bus #280 from campus (in front of Mondo Arancino Pizza). Ride the bus 12 stops and get off at the LGT RIPA/RIPENSE stop. From this stop, take bus #44 another 8 stops and then get off at the CARINI/BONNET stop. Then walk 2 minutes to the hospital (see map).  
**To return to campus:** Take bus #44 from the BONNET/CARINI stop for 7 stops to the CLODIO stop.

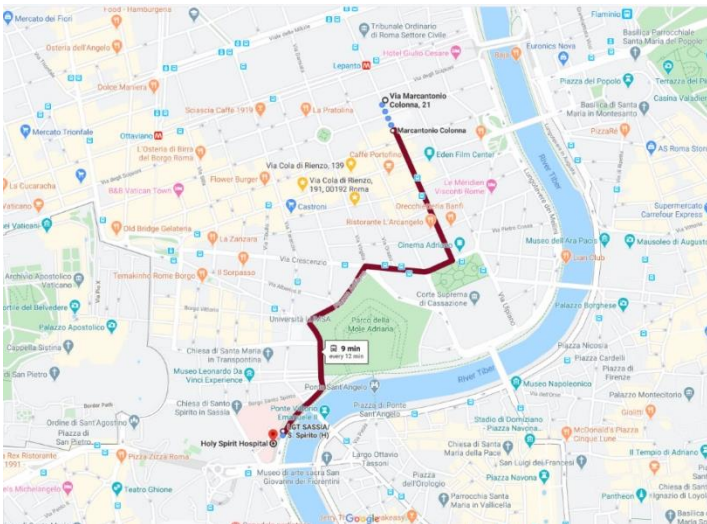

**Location:** Via Sant'Alberto Magno 5 (1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Apt. 3), Metro Line B: CIRCO MASSIMO stop.



**Directions from Campus:** Take the A line from the Lepanto stop (direction Anagnina). At the Termini stop, transfer to the B line (direction Laurentina). Get off at the CIRCO MASSIMO STOP. Walk down Via del Circo Massimo. Take a left onto Via di Valle Murcia, which turns into Via di Santa Sabia. Make a left onto Via Sant 'Alberto Magno. Look for building #5. If you reach Via Eufemiano, you've gone too far.

**To return to campus:** Take Via si Santa Sabina back to Via di Valle Murcia and then take the B line metro (direction Termini station). At Termini transfer back to the A line (direction Battistini) and exit the Lepanto stop.

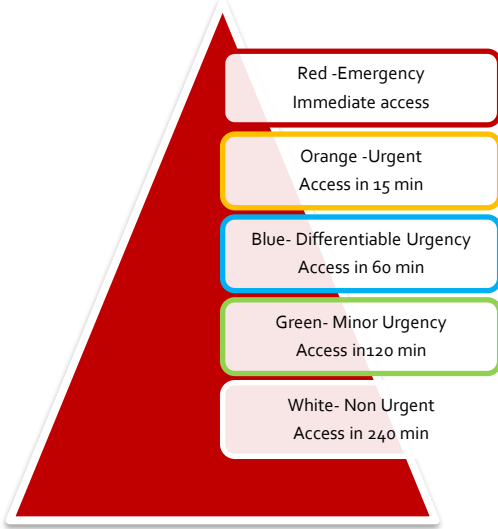
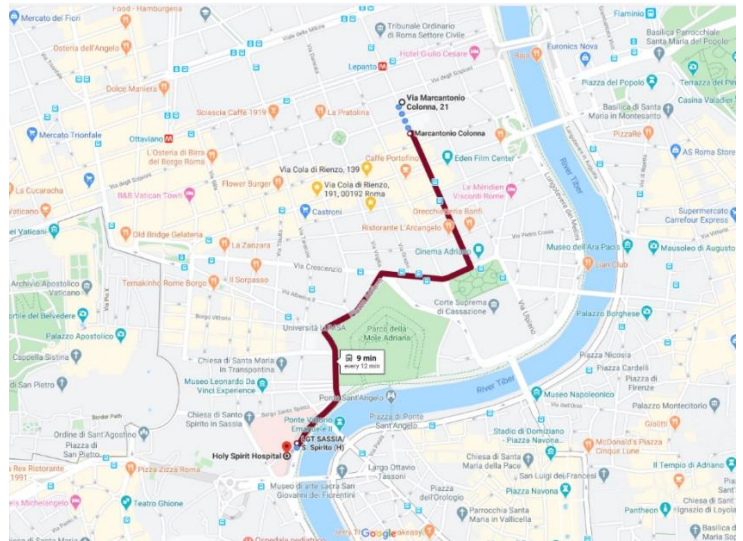

### Emergency Room Visits:

There are a number of serviceable emergency rooms in Rome, the closest being **OSPEDALE SANTO SPIRITO IN SAXIA**

Italian emergency rooms use the "triage" system, meaning that they determine the priority of patients' treatments based on the severity of their condition. Patients whose lives are in danger will be seen first. The wait time in Italian emergency rooms is often very long, anywhere from 1-4 hours or more. If it is a life or death situation,

you will be seen right away. However, less serious health issues will often be ended to last and the wait can be quite long. In the emergency room you will be given a number and a color based on the severity of your condition (red being the most serious, green and yellow being less grave.)

For non-life threatening situations, please get in touch with Dr. Andrea Guerriero who can advise you on the best place to get medical treatment. If there is an emergency you can call **112** the equivalent of 911. Taxis can also be useful in getting to the hospital, provided the student is well enough to arrive at the hospital without immediate assistance. You can always ask an administrator if you need assistance.
